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When surfers showed up, there were surfable waves in front of the cottage where the contest was being held. The cottage is owned by the Roy family and is next door to where Schaus, a former U.S. to the weather. We expect to navy man and member of the Buffalo Fire Department, lived. Matt Roy, a member of the surf club, was taught how to surf on the lake by Schaus.

> Schaus, who was an Eastern Surfing Association (ESA) Great Lakes co-director, started the Gales of November surf contests in 1998 as a way to show lake surfing was a viable activity. The contest is held in November because it's traditionally a stormy month and generates good waves on Lake Erie at places like Pleasant and Wyldewood beaches in Port Colborne and Crystal Beach in Fort Erie.



Sunday marked the day the Edmund Fitzgerald sank in a Lake Superior storm in 1975, with the loss of the entire crew of 29, and the anniversary of the great three-day storm of 1913 that claimed 250 lives and saw 12 ships sink across the Great Lakes. It also marked the day Schaus died, at the age of 58, in 2009. Club members were happy the way the contest went and said Schaus would have been proud to see all of the surfers competing. Waves held up for the four-hour contest which saw competition in stand-up paddle (SUP), women's, longboard and shortboard


